A driver diagram is a visual tool that maps out your team's plan for improvement, outlining how change will lead to achieving your goals.

A clear, measurable goal that defines what you want to improve, for whom, by when. Then, work through your primary and secondary drivers.



Primary Drivers

The key factors that directly influence your ability to achieve the improvement aim.

Secondary Drivers

Specific actions or conditions that support and strengthen the primary drivers.

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EXAMPLES
